HARVESTER FOOD PANTRY DATE CHANGE – Since the Calhoun Colt Show will be taking place on the normal Harvester's day, the Harvester's Food Pantry has been changed to Friday, September 29<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. The date will return to its normal schedule in October, which will be Friday, October 13<sup>th</sup>, starting at approximately 2 p.m. The Harvester's Food Pantry takes place the 2<sup>nd</sup> Friday of each month and is located at the Colt Show Building on the Calhoun Square. The service is free to anyone in need. We are also in need of volunteers to help with this service. **SIDEWALK PROJECT COMPLETE** - The new sidewalks and ditch work has been completed down Main Street. This project was completed by MoDOT as part of their overlay project for Highway 52 and was funded completely by MoDOT. The sidewalks were in dire need of repair and the City of Calhoun would like to thank the Department of Transportation for this service.

*CALHOUN RECEIVES GRANT* – The City of Calhoun was recently awarded the Missouri Department of Natural Resources Scrap Tire Material Grant in the amount of \$3,274.00. With these funds, 4 new picnic tables and 2 new benches, made of recycled tire material, will be purchased and placed on the Calhoun Courtyard and the Katy Park Trailhead.


## **JOKE OF THE MONTH**
