Junk is defined as any metal, glass, paper, rags, wood, machinery parts, cloth, or other waste or discarded material of any nature or substance whatsoever, or scrap or salvage materials. Burning of household trash and junk is not allowed. Furthermore, only one unlicensed vehicle can remain on a property for a period of up to one year.

The Calhoun City Council strongly urges residents to keep their property clean and free from junk. If you fail to do so, a summons may be issued.
