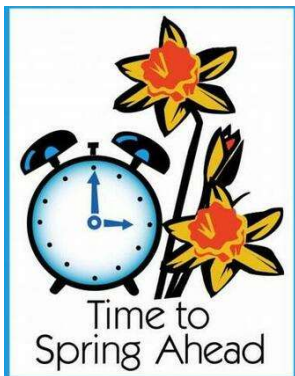




### STATEWIDE TORNADO DRILL

Missouri's 2024 statewide tornado drill will be held on Wednesday, March 6<sup>th</sup> at 11 a.m. This is an opportunity for Missourians to practice their sheltering plans and ensure readiness in case of a severe weather emergency while at home, work or school. If you do not have shelter, the Calhoun Baptist Church at 307 South College Street will be opened in the event of a tornado warning.

**2024 PET TAGS DUE:** If you own a pet, you must register it annually with the City Clerk. The cost of registration is \$2.50 per animal. Please bring a copy of the pet's current rabies vaccination with you at the time of registration. Remember that all dogs must be kept on the owner's property at all times or restrained by a leash. Dogs are not allowed to run at large. If you fail to register your animal or let your pet run loose, you may receive a summons.
